1. MATERIALS

- Worsted Weight (4) yarn in 6 colors:
 - A - Mint
 - B - Cream
 - C - Mustard
 - D - Light Pink
 - E - Mauve (ears)
 - F - Black & Pink (embroidery)
- 5.0 mm (H) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch markers (optional)



2. SIZE

Approx. 6.5" (16.5 cm) wide
59" (150 cm) long
(before blocking)



3. ABBREVIATIONS

- ch = chain
- sl st = slip stitch
- sc = single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- dc = double crochet
- tr = treble crochet
- st(s) = stitch(es)
- rep = repeat
- () = work instructions in same stitch
- ** = repeat across
- [] = total stitches

4. BASIC CROCHET STITCHES (US TERMS)

Chain (ch)



Yarn over, pull through loop on hook.

Slip Stitch (sl st)



Insert hook, yarn over, pull through both loops.

Single Crochet (sc)



Insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.

Half Double Crochet (hdc)



Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through all 3 loops.

Double Crochet (dc)



Yarn over, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through last 2 loops.

Treble Crochet (tr)



Yarn over twice, insert hook, yarn over, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through last 2 loops.

5. PATTERN – STRIPE SCARF

Notes:

- Scarf is worked lengthwise in rows.
- Change colors every few rows to create stripes.
- Ch 1 at the beginning of the row does not count as a stitch.

Stripe Sequence (Repeat)

- 4 rows A (Mint)
 - 4 rows B (Cream)
 - 4 rows C (Mustard)
 - 4 rows D (Light Pink)
 - 4 rows B (Cream)
 - 4 rows E (Mauve)
 - (E is used for cat ears row)
- Repeat until desired length, end with A (Mint).

How to Work:

- Foundation: Ch 26.
- Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and across. [25 sc]
- Row 2: Ch 1, turn, sc in each st across.
- Repeat Row 2 for pattern, changing colors every 4 rows.
- Continue until piece measures approx. 59" (150 cm).



6. CAT FACE APPLIQUE (Make 2 - One on each end)

Ears (Using color E)

- Ch 6.
 - Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc 4, turn. [4 sc]
 - Row 2: Ch 1, sc 4, turn.
 - Row 3: Ch 1, sc2tog, sc across to last 2 sts, sc2tog. [2 sc]
 - Fasten off, leave long tail for sewing.
- Sew ears to the mauve stripe positioned as shown.

Eyes (Using color F - Black)

- Use black yarn or embroidery.
- Create big oval eyes. (See image for placement)



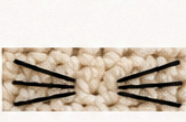
Nose (Using color F - Pink)

- Embroider small triangle nose centered between eyes.



Whiskers (Using color F - Black)

- Embroider 3 straight lines on each side of the nose.

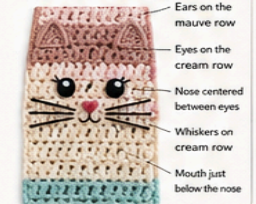


Mouth (Using color F - Black)

- Embroider a small smile under the nose.

7. FINISHING

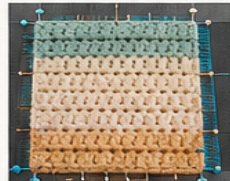
- Weave in all ends.
- Block the scarf (optional) for a neater finish.
- Your adorable cat scarf is ready!

8. COLOR GUIDE EXAMPLE

- A - Mint
 - B - Cream
 - C - Mustard
 - D - Light Pink
 - B - Cream
 - E - Mauve (ears)
- Repeat...
End with A - Mint



CROCHET BASICS TIPS

- Keep your tension even.
- Count your stitches.
- Change colors on the last yarn over of the last stitch.
- Use a yarn needle to weave in ends neatly.
- Blocking helps your scarf look more even.

♥ Enjoy crocheting your cute cat scarf! 🐾

Cat Scarf is soft, cozy, and beginner-friendly. The scarf is made with simple stitches, colorful stripes, and cute embroidered cat faces on both ends. This detailed tutorial follows the same structure and style shown in the infographic so anyone in the USA can crochet it from start to finish with confidence.

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Materials

You will need:

- Worsted Weight #4 yarn
- 5.0 mm (H) crochet hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Stitch markers (optional)

Yarn Colors

- A – Mint
- B – Cream
- C – Mustard
- D – Light Pink
- E – Mauve (ears)
- F – Black and Pink (face embroidery)

Finished Size

- Width: approximately 6.5 inches (16.5 cm)
- Length: approximately 59 inches (150 cm)

✨ Crochet Abbreviations (US Terms)

Abbreviation	Meaning
ch	chain
sl st	slip stitch
sc	single crochet
hdc	half double crochet
dc	double crochet
tr	treble crochet
st	stitch
rep	repeat

Basic Crochet Stitches

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Chain (ch)

Insert hook, yarn over, and pull through the loop on the hook.

Slip Stitch (sl st)

Insert hook into stitch, yarn over, pull through stitch and loop on hook.

Single Crochet (sc)

Insert hook into stitch, yarn over, pull up loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.

Half Double Crochet (hdc)

Yarn over, insert hook, pull up loop, yarn over, pull through all 3 loops.

Double Crochet (dc)

Yarn over, insert hook, pull up loop, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through remaining 2 loops.



Scarf Pattern

The scarf is worked in rows from one end to the other.

Foundation Row

With Color A (Mint):

- Chain 26

Row 1

- Dc in 3rd chain from hook
- Dc across row
- Turn

You should have 24 stitches.

Row 2

- Ch 2
- Dc across
- Turn

Repeat Row 2 throughout the pattern.



Stripe Color Sequence

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Follow this repeating stripe pattern:

Color	Rows
Mint (A)	4 rows
Cream (B)	4 rows
Mustard (C)	4 rows
Light Pink (D)	4 rows
Mauve (E)	4 rows
Cream (B)	8 rows

Repeat the sequence until scarf reaches approximately 59 inches long.

Finish with Mint rows on the opposite end for symmetry.

Making the Cat Ears

Each scarf end has two small crochet ears sewn onto the mauve stripe.

Make 4 ears total.

Ear Pattern

Using Color E (Mauve):

Row 1

- Ch 4
- Sc in 2nd ch from hook
- Sc across
- Turn

You should have 3 stitches.

Row 2

- Ch 1
- Sc increase in first stitch
- Sc in next stitch
- Sc increase in last stitch
- Turn

You should have 5 stitches.

Row 3

- Ch 1
- Sc across
- Fasten off leaving long tail for sewing

The ears should form a small triangle.

Sewing the Ears

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Place ears near the top of each scarf end on the mauve stripe.

- Sew one ear on the left side

- Sew the second ear on the right side
- Repeat on opposite scarf end

Make sure both sets are symmetrical.

Embroidering the Eyes

Using black yarn:

Create two oval-shaped eyes centered below the ears.

Eye Tips

- Use satin embroidery stitches
- Leave tiny white highlights for sparkle
- Keep spacing even

The eyes should look cute and slightly oversized.

Embroidering the Nose

Using pink yarn:

- Stitch a small upside-down triangle between the eyes

This creates the cat nose.

Embroidering the Mouth

Using black yarn:

- Stitch a tiny curved smile directly under the nose

Keep it delicate and centered.

Adding Whiskers

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Using black yarn:

- Stitch 3 straight whiskers on each side of the face

Angle them slightly upward for a playful look.

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Finishing

Weave in Ends

Use a yarn needle to hide all loose yarn tails.

Blocking

Optional but recommended.

- Lightly dampen scarf
- Lay flat
- Shape evenly
- Allow to dry completely

Blocking helps the scarf look neat and professional.

Helpful Crochet Tips

- Count stitches often
- Keep even tension
- Change colors during the final yarn-over of the previous stitch
- Use stitch markers if needed
- Do not pull embroidery stitches too tightly

Suggested Color Palette

This scarf looks beautiful in pastel shades, but you can customize it with:

- Lavender and white
- Blue and gray
- Pink and cream
- Rainbow stripes
- Holiday colors

Beginner Notes

This project is excellent for:

- Beginners learning double crochet
- Practicing color changes
- Learning embroidery details
- Making handmade gifts

The pattern is repetitive and relaxing, making it easy to crochet while watching TV or listening to music.
